



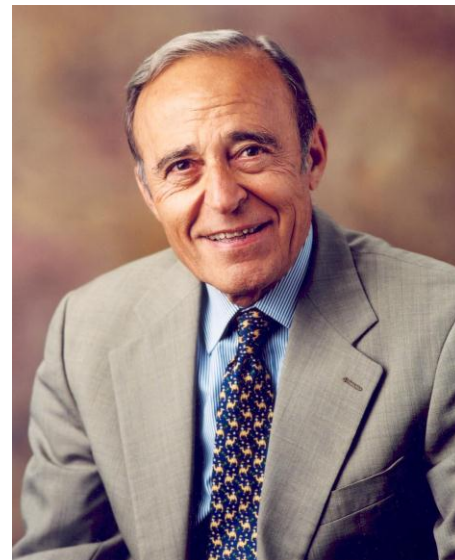
## TARLTON LAW LIBRARY PUBLISHES ORAL HISTORY INTERVIEW WITH PROFESSOR LINO GRAGLIA

AUSTIN, TEXAS (June 11, 2011) – The Tarlton Law Library at The University of Texas School of Law has recently published the oral history interview of Lino A. Graglia.

This interview continues Tarlton's mission to document the history of the School of Law and the legal history of Texas and the United States. The project began in 1986 when a grant from the Texas Sesquicentennial Commission funded five oral history interviews. Since that time, more than fifteen interviews have been published with School of Law faculty and alumni.

Professor Graglia is the A. Dalton Cross Professor at The University of Texas School of Law. Raised in Brooklyn, New York, he decided to pursue a career in law after studying at City College. Following an LLB from Columbia, Professor Graglia worked for the Justice Department, after which he spent twelve years in practice. He joined the UT faculty in 1966.

Professor Graglia has written widely in constitutional law and also teaches and writes in the area of antitrust. He is the author of *Disaster by Decree: The Supreme Court Decisions on Race and the Schools* (Cornell, 1976) and many articles. He was also a Visiting Professor at the University of Virginia School of Law.

In this oral history, Professor Graglia discusses his education and early career, his often controversial position on education and affirmative action, and the evolution of the Law School over the last forty years.
