**Biographical Sketch**

Harold Douglas Laycock (1948- ), a University of Texas at Austin law professor, has argued several cases before the U.S. Supreme Court, testified before congressional committees, and written more than 25 legal commentaries. He married University of Texas sociology professor Teresa A. Sullivan in 1971.

After graduating from Michigan State University in 1970, Laycock attended the University of Chicago Law School, where he earned his J.D. in 1973. He went on to clerk for Judge Walter Cummings of the U.S. Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals, 1973-74, practice law in Austin, Texas, 1974-76, and teach at the University of Chicago Law School, 1976-81, before coming to the University of Texas Law School in 1981. He held a series of endowed professorships from 1983 to 1988, when he was appointed to the Alice McKean Young Regents Chair in law. Laycock's specialties include freedom of religion, employment discrimination, remedies, and commercial law.

**Scope and Content Note**

Legal documents, correspondence, creative works, and printed material, 1971-1988 (84"), arranged in seven series, document the pro bono case work, teaching, administrative activities, and research of Douglas Laycock. Legal case files representing approximately one-third of the material cover venues from Texas and Illinois county courts to the U.S. Supreme Court (three cases) and address a wide range of topics, including habeas corpus, race discrimination in employment, and securities fraud. The use of statistics in law is demonstrated in case files and described in course materials, which otherwise consist largely of annotated legal opinions and exams for classes in civil procedure, commercial law, employment discrimination, equity, governmental immunities, and remedies. Although most files of creative works -- concentrating on religious freedom, civil rights, and education issues -- lack complete drafts of articles or presentations, they include correspondence with editors, reviewers, and participants in arguments Laycock was studying, as well as research notes. Laycock's active opposition to the Robert H. Bork nomination to the U.S. Supreme Court is reflected in his accumulation of correspondence with Joe Biden and reports published by People for the American Way Action Fund, NAACP Legal Defense and Education Fund, and the Public Citizen Litigation Group. Student files hold letters of recommendation and grade reports, with little other correspondence.

During the 1980s, Laycock and Sullivan published several articles about sex discrimination in insurance, contributed to legal briefs in related cases, and Laycock testified on behalf of the American Association of University Professors before congressional committee hearings. Materials created or gathered by Laycock and Sullivan are arranged here in nine subseries: Research Materials -- Author Files, Research Materials -- Research Notes, Research Materials -- General Published Materials, Legal Case Files, Articles by Laycock and Sullivan, Nondiscrimination in Insurance Act, Society of American Law Teachers Panel, Presentation to Levinson's Class, and General Correspondence. About 8" of the materials were originally in folders labeled "Manhart correspondence" or "Manhart Misc.," named for City of Los Angeles v. Manhart, 435 U.S. 702 (1978), one of the first sex discrimination in insurance suits.
